### **Free Paint on Offer in Nottinghamshire**

Nottinghamshire County Council are running some one off events at Calverton and Worksop Household Waste Recycling Centres this summer where Nottinghamshire residents can pick up some free paint from our Community RePaint schemes.

Unwanted/surplus paint is accepted at both of these sites and site staff open each tin to check each donation. Any tins that are at least half full of reusable paint are stored separately in our shelved reuse container and are given away for free. We give this paint to community groups who are registered on our scheme throughout the year but as we have an excess of reusable paint, we're opening the scheme up to members of the public.

### **Transition Belper Wins 'Community Energy Challenge' Funding**

Transition Belper in Derbyshire has won a share of £200,000 worth of support to help develop community-owned renewable energy projects. The group is one of just seven in the UK to win a national competition, set up by the Co-operative and the Centre for Sustainable Energy (CSE). The aim is to energise the community-owned energy sector and bring about a clean energy revolution across the UK.

The Co-operative wants to see a dramatic increase in community owned renewable energy generation and hope that the winning communities will demonstrate replicable

technologies and the benefits of community ownership that can leave a lasting legacy for the next generation.

The expertise and support, which will include specialist mentoring, enterprise development and technical advice, will help the group to explore and develop community-owned and run hydro power projects in the Derwent Valley world heritage corridor between Cromford and Derby. The Community Energy Challenge will nurture community projects until they are ready for further investment and build. They will then be eligible for other assistance from The Co-operative including The Co-operative Enterprise Hub's revolving £400,000 fund to underwrite community share offers, and finance from The Co-operative Bank which has ear-marked £100 million for community renewables.

### **Green Power Team Volunteers Needed**

The Partnership Council are looking for unemployed Nottingham City residents who want to take part in an exciting and comprehensive volunteering package designed to help them back into work and support them while they are out of work. Their next project begins on 3<sup>rd</sup> July and the commitment required is two days per week.

The package includes practical work outdoors under the supervision of an experienced team leader, accredited training course in horticulture (Level 1 Award in Practical Horticulture and option of City & Guilds) and career advice sessions. Places are available to people who are unemployed, over 18 but not yet retired, and resident within the boundaries of Nottingham City. Please note that places on this project are for volunteers and are not work placements.

To take part in this exciting project you need to be able to commit yourself to two days per week (Tuesdays and Thursdays 10.00am – 4.00pm) for two months (unless you go into paid work before the two months ends or need to attend job interviews, etc). ### **Insulation Installations to Plummet Under Green Deal**

The government's own assessment of the Green Deal, its new green policy to make homes more energy efficient, suggests that it looks set to fail. The Department for Energy and Climate Change have estimated that once the scheme is launched in the autumn of this year installations of loft insulation will plummet by 83% and cavity walls by a similar

amount. Only insulation of solid walls is expected to rise, due to government grants that will be available.

Department of Energy and Climate Change (Decc) statistics show that 10 million (43%) of all lofts require more insulation and that 8 million home with cavity walls (42%) have yet to be insulated.

Currently loft and cavity wall insulation can be installed in homes for free, or at a highly subsidised cost. This will end in December 2012. Westmill Solar Farm, which is based on the Oxfordshire/Wiltshire border is offering shares in the only large solar farm in Britain aiming for community ownership. The farm was completed last July, so benefit from the highest level of FITS.

Woolhope Woodheat is a Community Co-operative which installs wood fuel boilers free of charge to hard-to heat buildings. The Co-operaitve then supplies heat at a reduced price over fossil fuel, with woodchip from local, sustainable woodlands. You can join the co-operative and get a return on your investment while doing something real to reduce carbon emissions and save neglected woodland from decay.
